





Elements of prima facie case for copyright infringement (for reproduction right)

- it's a copyrighted work
 (copyrightable subject matter)
- 2. copying
- 3. substantial appropriation





17 U.S.C. § 106

Subject to sections 107 through 122, the owner of copyright under this title has the exclusive rights to do and to authorize any of the following:

- (1) to <u>reproduce</u> the copyrighted work in copies or phonorecords;
- (2) to prepare derivative works based upon the copyrighted work;
- (3) to <u>distribute</u> copies or phonorecords of the copyrighted work to the public by sale or other transfer of ownership, or by rental, lease, or lending;
- (4) in the case of literary, musical, dramatic, and choreographic works, pantomimes, and motion pictures and other audiovisual works, to <u>perform</u> the copyrighted work <u>publicly</u>;
- (5) in the case of literary, musical, dramatic, and choreographic works, pantomimes, and pictorial, graphic, or sculptural works, including the individual images of a motion picture or other audiovisual work, to display the copyrighted work publicly; and
- (6) in the case of sound recordings, to <u>perform</u> the copyrighted work <u>publicly</u> by means of a digital audio transmission.
