






#### Newton' s Third Law of Motion


For every action, there is an equal and opposite reaction



(or really *my* Newton's Third Law of IP)


For every IP entitlement, there is an equal and opposite reduction in freedom. Why is intellectual property law necessary?




In the U.S., the main justification is an economic story (for copyrights, patents, and trade secrets)












